



ALUPE UNIVERSITY FAREWELL HOME

GOVERNANCE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

1. All bodies to be received at the reception must have a positive identity with a caretaker/ relative, or a known associate of the person identified as dead.
2. The caretaker must possess all details concerning the deceased: Including identity card Number, and history of the deceased, for purposes of preparing the death permit.
3. No cash payment shall be allowed at the facility
4. Bodies from across the borders of Kenya must have Authorized approval to have the body processed in Kenya (either Police or Administrative units recognized by respective law) as guided by the Provisions of the Anatomy Act (CAP 249)
5. Wailing, the hooting of cars or motorbikes, and any other unnecessary noise, that may cause public disturbance is prohibited at least 500 Meters from the University surroundings
6. Bodies handled or collected by Police officers with active legal implications will not be accepted at the Alupe University Farewell home.

LEGAL FRAMEWORK

All operations at the Alupe University Farewell Home will be governed by the following laws:

- i. Donation of bodies for purposes of teaching/research will be in accordance with the Anatomy ACT, CAP 249, of the Laws of Kenya (revised edition of 2012)
- ii. Issuance of the death certificate (Birth & Death Registration Act (CAP 149)
- iii. The Human Tissue Act (CAP 252)
- iv. Removal, disinterring, or examination of a dead body, section 386, 387, ad 388 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CAP 75).
